



**God gave Adam and Eve
a new son, Seth.**

Genesis 4:25



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☆Let's Talk

- ASK** Adam and Eve sinned against God. But God made a promise to take care of their sin. *What did God promise?*
- SAY** He promised to send a Savior. God had a wonderful plan to send someone many years later from Eve's family line who would pay for Adam and Eve's sin and the sin of all God's people.
- SAY** First, God gave Adam and Eve two sons, Cain and Abel. Abel trusted God, but Cain did not. Cain killed Abel.
- ASK** Some time later, God gave Adam and Eve a new son. *What was his name?*
- SAY** God gave Adam and Eve a new son named Seth. Many years later, Jesus, God's promised Savior, was born into Seth's family line. God always keeps his promises!

☆Let's Sing and Do

Bring several baby blankets or towels to class. Give each child a blanket. Do these motions as you sing to the tune *Here We Go Round the Mulberry Bush*.



- 1** God made a promise to Adam and Eve,
Adam and Eve, Adam and Eve.
God made a promise to Adam and Eve—
He promised to send a Savior!
(wave blanket overhead, like a praise banner)
- 2** Adam and Eve had baby Seth,
Baby Seth, baby Seth.
Adam and Eve had baby Seth—
God would keep his promise!
(spread blanket, lay picture on it)
- 3** Through Seth's family, Jesus came,
Jesus came, Jesus came.
Through Seth's family, Jesus came—
Jesus is the Savior!
(bundle blanket, rock gently)
- 4** We believe God's promises,
God's promises, God's promises,
We believe God's promises—
He always keeps his Word!
(fold blanket, hold open like a book)

☆Let's Pray

Gather for prayer. Ask children to repeat this prayer after you, sentence by sentence.

Dear God, thank you for your promise of a Savior. Thank you for sending Jesus to be our Savior. Thank you that you always keep your promises. Please help us to trust in you more. In Jesus' name, Amen.
